Last week, Evanston 5th Ward Alderman Robin Rue Simmons boldly and generously offered her recently purchased property to serve as a temporary emergency shelter. The community rallied to gather donations and supplies needed to fully outfit the space. Simmons' action and support helped spark momentum throughout the city and led to more solutions. As of Tuesday, March 24, 11 individuals have been moved into hotels and additional hotel options for more people are being arranged. One woman said that "this feels like paradise."

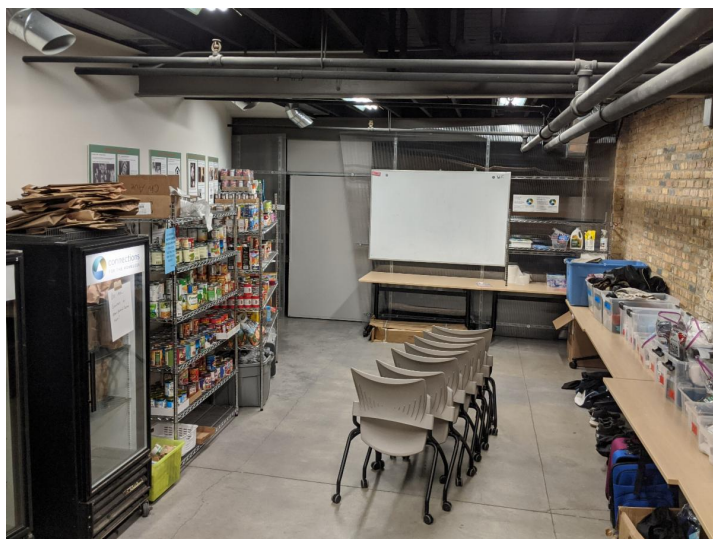

We recently spoke with the Chicago Tribune about how

- Food pantry, mail access, bagged lunches, showers and bathroom access Monday - Friday between 9:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. with 45-60 participants visiting each day
- Our House, Connections young adult transitional shelter operating business as usual
- 40 hotel rooms and counting opened for homeless individuals and families.
- Hilda's Place men's transitional shelter expanded to 24/7 service
- In addition to Simmons' house, temporary emergency shelter for 20 individuals at Lake Street Church opened today and is already at capacity (pictured above)
