Clergymen set up vigils for Evanston homeless

EPISCOPAL AND Baptist leaders in Evanston said Thursday they will sponsor a series of all-night prayer vigils for an estimated 30 to 40 homeless people in the suburb. The clergymen will invite the homeless to join them in the prayer vigils, said Rev. Robert V. Thompson. "The growing numbers of homeless people in this community are alarming to the sensibilities of religious people," Father Thompson said.
