## ***From the Executive Director...***

Dear Friends and Supporters of Connections,

November marked my first anniversary at Connections. As I've reached that milestone, I've been reflecting on the past year, and I want to tell you some things about Connections. Not the statistics of the good work we are doing every day. Not the list of services, sometimes life-saving, that our dedicated staff are providing to our community's most vulnerable citizens.

I want to tell you something about what Connections does for me and what it can do for you.

Without Connections I would not have come to know our dedicated staff and our amazing Board of Directors. Our staff is phenomenal, and it is a privilege to work alongside them every day. Likewise, I am so grateful to have come to know each of our Board members and to have been witness to their leadership in action in the community.


Without Connections I would not have had the opportunity to meet so many of you, our generous supporters. I would not have come to hear the stories of what you do, how you work alongside us in the community. None of Connections' work is done alone; you too are engaged in this work when you help a neighbor who has lost their job, when you take up an offering in your congregation to assist a needy family, when you organize a winter coat or toy drive at your office. It is truly my privilege to serve alongside each and every one of you. Thank you.

Without Connections for the Homeless, I would not have met Debra. At my first Connections event, Debra marched up to me and (rightfully) told me that she was angry that we hadn't housed her yet. She had been homeless for 13 years, and she told me if we didn't house her she was going to die. She didn't die. She is housed, and she is wonderful.

Without Connections I would not have heard a story, just a few weeks ago, about a couple you may know. This couple has been very present in front of CVS and the Barnes & Noble in downtown Evanston for some time. Keith is a veteran and has been homeless for 11 years – his partner, Susan, has been homeless for seven years. After over a year of working with Keith and Susan, we housed them at the beginning of February. Between Debra, Keith and Susan, we ended 31 years of homelessness. And that is our work with just three of our participants, and in just one year.

Now just one more story. Just before the holidays our outreach worker was doing his usual Tuesday duty at the Evanston Public library. Library staff alerted him to the presence of a young man they were worried about. Tito followed along, and the staff led him to where the young man was – curled up on the floor between the bookshelves in a far corner of the library. That young man had never heard of Connections, and let me tell you, you don't sleep on the library floor if you think you have anywhere else to go. In February, that young man entered Our House as our newest resident, in his own room, in his own bed, in a safe place, his home.

I invite you to be a part of this wonderful organization which brings me such great joy, to continue the good work you are doing in your community alongside us, with us. These days the news is full of stories of what doesn't work, what is broken. My hope is that you will know that there are things that are not broken, that are working and working well, and that you know you are a part of it.

# **THRIVE: *The North Shore's New Premier Tasting Party***

A year ago, Connections decided to break the traditional gala mold and try something fresh and new. In November, the reimagined event was unveiled, and excitement spread like wildfire. Within just 10 days, THRIVE was sold out!

On February 11, Connections for the Homeless hosted 280 people from Evanston and the North Shore at THRIVE, its annual gala. The gala exceeded Connections' fundraising goal, raising over \$270,000.

"This level of support from the community is so important right now, and we are extremely grateful," said Betty Bogg, Connections' Executive Director. "We are moving forward with our goal of increasing private donations to mitigate any future loss of funding that could result from the continuing State of Illinois budget impasse. The donations we received through the gala represent both large increases from current donors and first donations from new donors. That's what it will take for us to aggressively combat homelessness, regardless of what the State of Illinois does."

The event, held at Architectural Artifacts in Chicago, took a different format than in past years. Instead of a sit-down dinner, 11 Evanston and Chicago-area restaurants set up tasting stations featuring one of their signature dishes. Restaurants included Boltwood, Found, Hearty Boys, Intro, La Principal, Libertad, Lulus, Peckish Pig, Ten Mile House, Union Squared, and Wow Bao. Ward Eight and Temperance both supported the event with beverage donations.

For dessert, guests participated in a competitive "Sugar Rush," where groups of guests bid for the right to choose their desserts first from selections donated by Bang Bang Pie & Biscuits, Bennison's Bakery, Beth's Little Bakeshop, DB3 Donuts, First Slice Pie Café, Hewn, Hoosier Mama Pie Co., Patisserie Coralie, Three Tarts Bakery & Café, Wow Bao, and XO Marshmallow.

Music at the gala was provided by the Lakeside Pride Strayhorns. Activities included a silent auction and a weighted raffle featuring several travel opportunities, sporting events, tickets to *Hamilton*, a necklace by Chloe, and a collection of assorted wines donated by Connections' Board of Directors.

"We sought to 'break the mold' with the gala this year," said gala chair Jill Greer of Evanston. "Connections does such amazing work, and our committee wanted the gala to be new and exciting so as to engage new donors and encourage current donors to increase their support. We also wanted to create a unique event that people will look forward to from year to year because it is different from all of the other galas. Judging by people's reactions and the money we raised, we were successful. And we will be doing this again!"

The success of the gala also came from the support of very generous sponsors. The Presenting Sponsor was Keystone Capital, with Silver Sponsors BMO Harris Bank, the Foglia Family Foundation, Honigman, and The Private Bank.

# Drop-In: *More Than Just Showers*

After being shuttered for nearly nine months due to the State budget impasse, Connections' Drop-In reopened on April 4, 2016.

“Several factors made it possible for us to re-open Drop-In two days a week last April: the success of our THRIVE gala last spring, advocacy by Congresswoman Robyn Gabel, and a grant from the Evanston Community Foundation,” noted Betty Bogg, Executive Director.

“The Foundation found that the issue Connections was solving was a basic human right, and we want to make sure that people who are experiencing homelessness have that right met. And we thought it was important for us to get involved,” said Monique B. Jones, President of the Evanston Community Foundation.

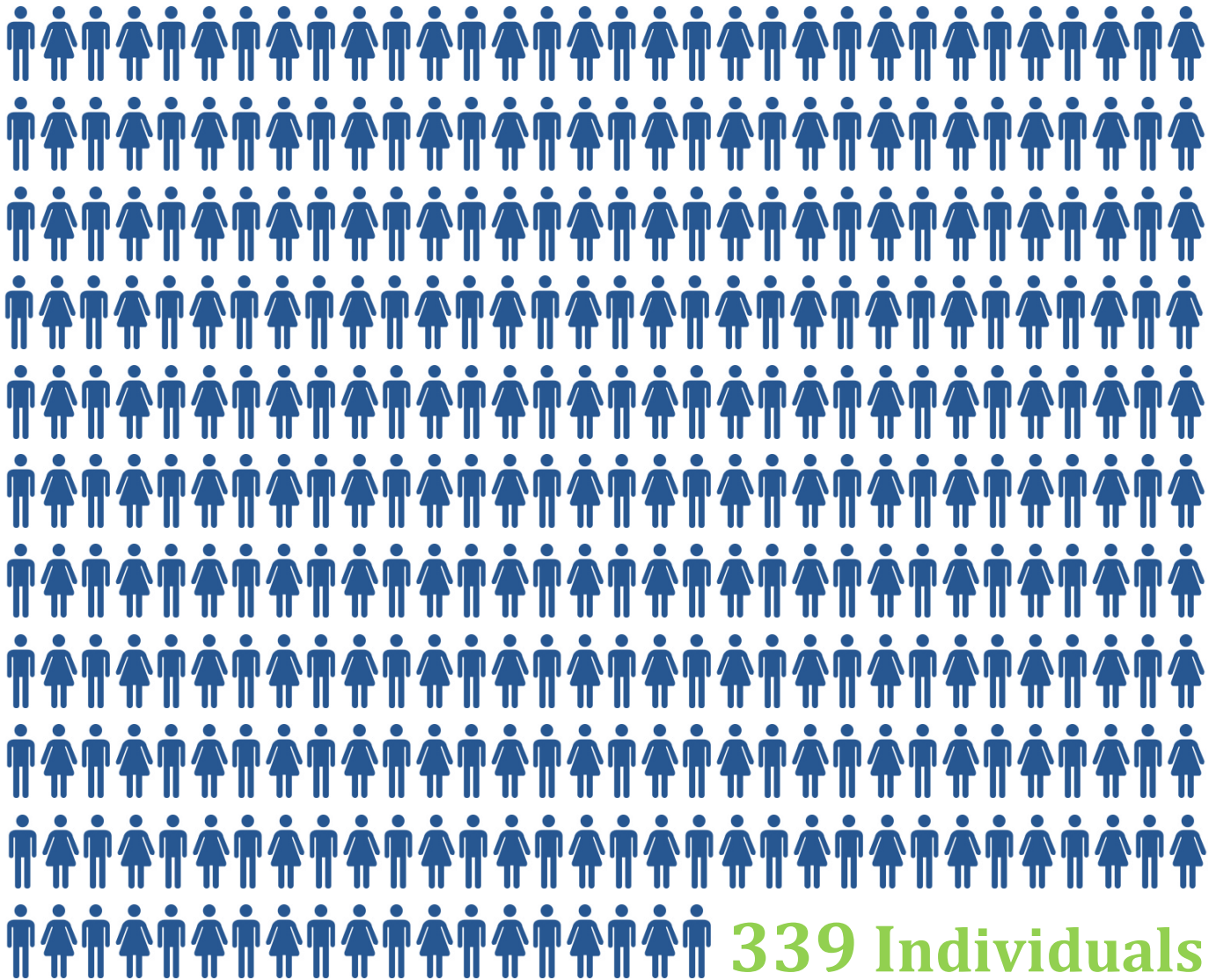
Currently open only two afternoons a week, the Drop-In Center is always at capacity, and returning operations to 5 days a week is a primary goal for Connections. Once the facility can be fully staffed again, additional layers of services that will enrich existing programming and help people to take action for long-term change will be incorporated.

## **Connections' Vision for Drop-In:**

- Allows people to come in on their own schedules.
- Provides classes and workshops on topics requested by participants.
- Connects tutors and mentors from the community to participants who are working on educational goals.
- Provides opportunity for purposeful and productive activity as people are seeking housing and looking to regain stability.

**Since April 4, 2016, 10 clients who came to Connections through Drop-In have been permanently housed!  
And an additional 57 have entered into interim housing.**

# The Finnegan Family Matching Grant: *Going Above & Beyond*

For many years (several decades, in fact), the Finnegan Family Foundation has been a major supporter of Connections for the Homeless, often stepping in with a large grant just when we need it most. For example, several years ago when Homelessness Prevention funding was in jeopardy, the Foundation partnered with Connections to keep that program going by providing a grant of \$50,000 specifically to help people to catch up on payments on their mortgages or rents so they would not lose their homes.

In July, when we submitted our annual grant proposal to the Foundation, Woody McCally, the Foundation's Program Officer, called to share that the Foundation would be renewing its support. "But Woody also had a question. He asked how Hilda's Place was doing, because Paul and Mary Finnegan were interested in making a challenge grant that would encourage other people to help replace government funding that was no longer being designated for shelter," said Sue Loellbach, Connections' Director of Development. "They understood one of our primary goals was to make Hilda's Place be a fully community-funded program, and they wanted to help."

The Matching Challenge was announced to donors in August, and a goal of raising \$50,000 in new or increased gifts by December 31 was set. With 33% of annual donations from individuals being received during the months of November and December, the timing of the challenge couldn't have been better. Connections promoted the Challenge through its fall luncheon, monthly newsletters, and the year-end appeals to let donors know that they had an opportunity to double their impact.

"Many people called our office to review how much they had given in the past and how much of a new gift would be counted toward the challenge," Sue noted. "Many current donors told their friends, who had not support Connections in the past, about the challenge, hoping to increase the number of new donations. And other people who had never given before were inspired to do so because of the challenge."

**Connections is proud to announce that, during the Matching Challenge, a total of \$131,333 was received in new and increased donations from 455 individual donors – more than doubling the Challenge’s goal.**

In a time of continued insecurity with government funding, this support is not only financially indispensable, but incredibly reassuring and morale-boosting for the agency. Knowing that we have such committed supporters – both the Finnegan and all the donors who took us above and beyond our goal – is encouragement for us to forge ahead.

Connections extends its sincerest gratitude to the The Finnegan Family Foundation for all they do for the community at many different levels. We are so grateful to be included among those they support, as they allow us to do so much more to help those in need.

# Making a Difference:

It's no secret that Connections' biggest asset and key to success is our staff and volunteers. ## KEYUANA DORDEN

### *CASE MANAGER – FAMILY SUPPORTIVE HOUSING (FSH)*

**How long have you worked at Connections? Have you always had the same position?** I have worked at Connections for a little over 7 years. Initially, I worked at Hilda's Place for about 3 years and then transitioned over to FSH.

**How do you explain your job to family and friends?** I help families that were homeless to regain stability.

**What has been your most memorable experience?** Moving a family into an apartment in Skokie. The family was from the west side of Chicago and had been in a domestic violence shelter in Downers Grove for several months. When the children (4 of them – ages 2, 3, 6, and 13) came into the apartment, they all had on backpacks. After unpacking some items, the mom asked if I could take her to pick up some items. As we are preparing to leave, the kids started putting their backpacks on (their clothing and belongings were inside). I explained to them that they could leave the backpacks in the apartment because they lived here now. They still couldn't believe it.

**What do you enjoy most about working at Connections?** I can say that I love the relationships that I have with the clients here at Connections. Across all programs, I love talking with the clients about things going on with them, outside of their obvious situations. I love the history that I have with so many clients here.

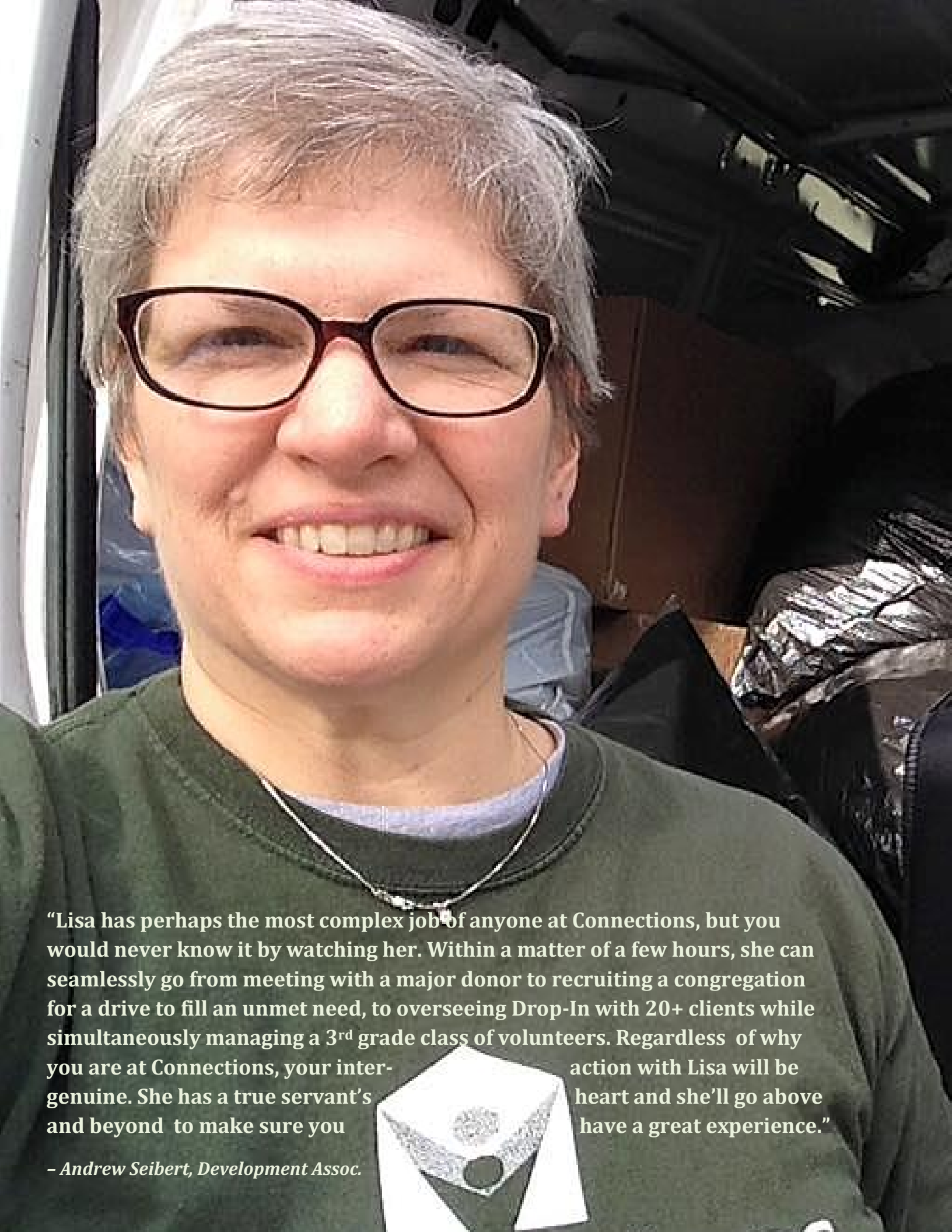
**Is there a quote/motto you live by?** I don't think I have a motto or quote that I live by. Every day I think of ways to be a better person and encourage someone else. It helps me tremendously when I can be a blessing to someone else.

# LISA TODD, *COMMUNITY RELATIONS MANAGER*

**How long have you worked at Connections? Have you always had the same position?** I started as the Volunteer Coordinator in May 2010. When we were able to add stipend volunteers to take on the basics of the Volunteer Program, I was able to do more outreach in the community – cultivating new relationships and support and providing some education about homelessness and poverty and how our programs strive to address those realities. Currently, I do both the volunteer management and outreach.

**How do you explain your job to family and friends?** I describe my role as Volunteer Manager and Educator, helping people understand how their time, stuff or money will have positive impact on people who are homeless and on their community as a whole.

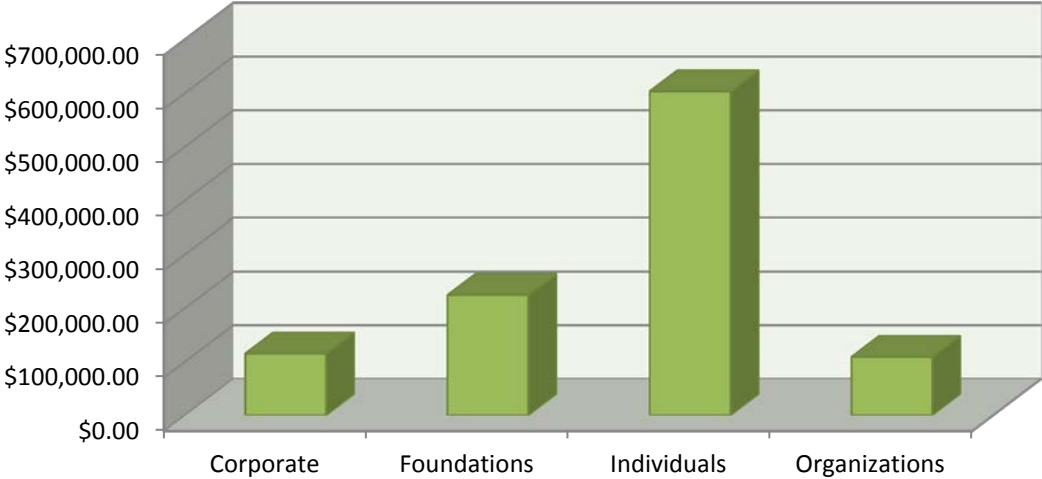
**What has been your most memorable experience at Connections?** There have been a lot. I'll give you a more recent one. During one of our January service days, I asked the people who had come to clean and sort donations if they'd like a tour of the shelter. One man came forward and said that he would like to take a tour. He pulled me aside and confided that he was actually a former resident of Hilda's Place. It had been a long time since he was homeless. He ended up going into the military and serving in Afghanistan. He was going to school but had the day off. He said, "Today is my birthday. It seemed like a really great way to celebrate how far I've come."

**What are you proud of accomplishing at Connections?** I'm proud that we have broadened our volunteer pool, including so many of our financial donors who also volunteer their time. I'm really proud of all the young people – the Scouts, Mitzvah or confirmation students, high school service clubs and sports teams that have organized donation drives or cooked at Hilda's Place or made bag lunches for Drop-In. I am proud of the next generation and our ability to engage with them, creating ways for them to be problem solvers and empathetic citizens alongside us.

**Is there a quote/motto you live by?** "Everybody wants to feel that their life has purpose. Everybody wants to be important." Part of my job is finding ways to make that possible – in a real way and in a way that will truly help our programs and be a good use of our time and resources.
